In workshops and rehearsals, the company explored human connectedness to the environment, where tiny moments fill the space. The piece is accompanied by an evocative film projection made by Rachel. Choreography Rachel Canavan and dancers.

PULSE is a high energy exploration of the way music moves us, how it makes us feel and the energy it gives us. Emily reflects on personal moments and memories of when she has connected to music. She moves through different styles from contemporary to hip hop. Pulse looks to celebrate the joy and power that the synergy of music and movement creates.
