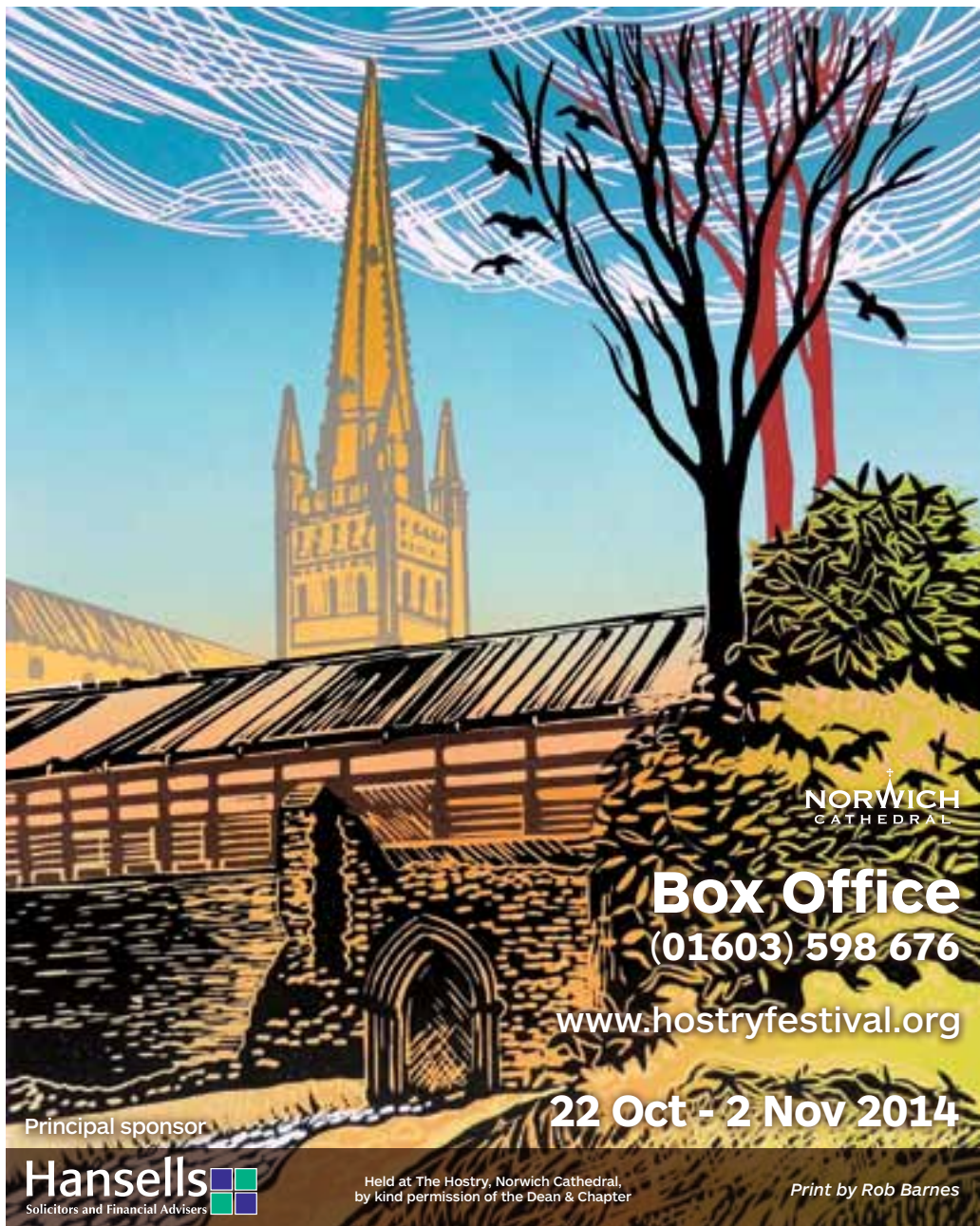

# Paint Out Norwich

Artists are encouraged to use their choice of art media and to select any vantage point at the six historic Norwich locations. The paintings will be exhibited at The Hostry, Norwich Cathedral, and judged by a panel of experts. They will select one painting from each artist to enter into an auction hosted by TW Gaze of Diss, where ticket holders will have the chance to bid for the first ever Paint Out Norwich paintings. In addition, prizes will be awarded on the Gala Launch Night and Auction on 23<sup>rd</sup> October. The People's Choice Award will be announced in the Eastern Daily Press on Monday 3<sup>rd</sup> November.

'Paint Out' Norwich aims to attract national and international talent by introducing an event that focuses on the challenges imposed by painting 'on the spot' in the urban environment.

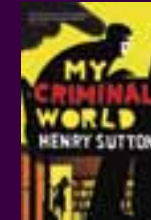
**PATRICK BARKHAM** was born in 1975 in Norfolk and educated at Cambridge University. He is a features

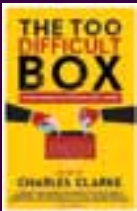


