After the resounding success of 2016, The Hostry Festival continues to grow in reputation, engaging with more new people every year. 2017 sees us programming our 7th festival, continuing to focus on the development of our four core projects, enabling them to deliver even better results not only during the extended full two weeks of the festival but throughout the year.

THE NORFOLK ARTS AWARDS is now profiled over four pages, enabling you to see exactly who’s been nominated for special recognition of their work in the arts. Get involved with us on this throughout the summer on social media in the build up to **the EDP People’s Choice Award**, your opportunity to vote on who should be acclaimed for their contribution to the arts in Norfolk.

TOTAL ENSEMBLE THEATRE COMPANY was part of the opening of Norfolk and Norwich Festival 2017, with a specially commissioned piece entitled **It’s A Wonderful Moon George**, performed outside the Forum. For this year’s Hostry Festival you will have a chance to see this truly unique display of inclusive Movement Theatre as well as a taster of their full scale production in development for 2018. Taking place on Saturday 21st October, tickets include post performance champagne, Booja Booja truffles and ice cream.

James Colman’s **PAINT OUT NORWICH**, taking place over five days and nights, is set to produce stunning Plein Air artwork, all produced in three hour periods from artists who can be seen throughout our city by following a special new arts trail. The trail is suitable for the whole family to enjoy over two days, with a gala viewing of all the results and an exhibition for the full duration of the festival. Our front cover for 2017 has been especially commissioned from Paint Out Norwich artist Gennadiy V. Ivanov.

With Melvyn Bragg’s especially adapted play last year being such a success, Melvyn is now a patron of the festival. Following on from last year’s success we challenged ourselves to come up with something equally original, and we have: a revival of a long lost classic, **not seen in Norfolk for 70 years**, and without doubt one of the most highly charged French love stories ever told... We present **THE EAGLE HAS TWO HEADS by Jean Cocteau**. This truly magnificent romantic melodrama boasts an outstanding cast of actors, plus live music from Ivan McCready, cello, and Caroline Bishop, violin, which will be performed alongside a specially recorded score created with Sotos Yiasimi at Ashwood Studios. For the first time we will be performing fully in the round, ‘arena style’. Do not miss this stunning Hostry Festival Central Production.

Other festival highlights include:
Oscar winning actress and new festival patron, **Hayley Mills In Conversation**, profiling her hugely successful career in film. Mustard TV’s **Never Too Late!** returns with a thoroughly entertaining profile of people in retirement age trying something they’ve never done before. For the first time with us, Stuff Of Dreams Theatre Company perform their newly written play **Anglia Mist**. Mary Ward MBE & Jo Collins MBE, founders of Chickenshed Theatre Company present

their **special tribute to Julian of Norwich** which was first performed at Norwich Cathedral earlier this year. Helen McDermott and Desmond Barrit present their delicious new musical revue **Curtain Up**. Xenia Home and Norfolk Music Hub have worked with us to curate a concert of emerging talent showcasing young classical musicians from across the county. The event will be held at the new Blake Studio in the company of our guest of honour and concert patron **Julian Lloyd Webber**.

BBC Radio Norfolk present the **Festival Special show, LIVE from the Hostry Building** and the **Inspiring Females In The Arts** debate, LIVE from Norwich High School for Girls. Anyone interested in making a career in the arts will have a rare chance to hear Spotlight’s **John Colclough In Conversation**. We are also so fortunate to welcome historian **Dr David Starkey** as our guest speaker for the first time. To conclude the programme, we celebrate the new original songs from festival favourite **Hayley Moyses and Friends** (with guest appearances from London Street singers Felix Simpson and Bill Downs).

Before you begin your travels through our 28 page brochure, huge thanks go to all our new and regular partners in business, trusts, charities and individuals, as well as all our media partners.

And so, on behalf of everyone on the festival team, I thank you all for your support and interest, and I greatly look forward to seeing you at our festival launch night on Monday 4th September and then at the Autumn Festival of Norfolk – 15th to 29th October 2017.

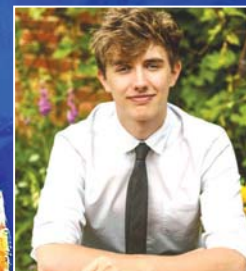

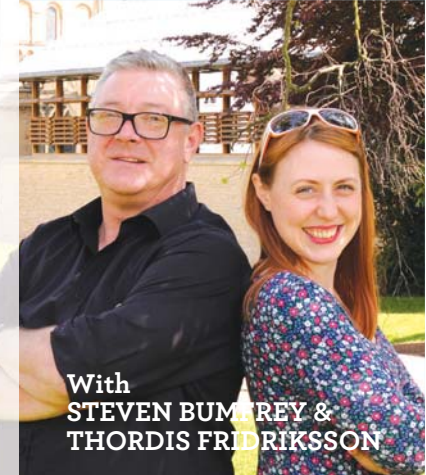

Paint Out Norwich 2017

Paint Out Norwich is an ambitious and exciting live art experience held over five days to showcase the challenge of *en plein air* art creation – painting, drawing, or printing, away from the studio, outside, in all lights and weathers.

At the heart of the event is the UK's only juried Plein Air art competition, in which dozens of carefully selected national and international artists compete in a medium of their choice to produce artworks at a variety of landmarks throughout the streets of iconic and Medieval Norwich.

Paint Out thrives on immersing people in the whole process of dynamic art creation, from blank canvas to finished production, in a matter of mere hours and days. This is immediate art-in-the-raw for artists and viewers alike.

Building on the success of the last three years, and our recent invitational at the **Royal Norfolk Show**, the 2017 competition includes varied media categories in oil, watercolour, mixed media, drawing, digital and print. In addition, we have two nights of a unique **Nocturne** evening painting event and a **Freestyle** option to paint larger works over two days.

Renowned for innovation and invention, *Paint Out* has also pioneered this year, painting from an open-top double-decker bus for a new rooftop elevation; watch out for it popping up around Norwich during the competition.

All this provides plenty of engaging opportunities for members of the public to see first-hand how these talented artists work against the clock and in a constantly changing environment.

Hundreds of fresh and diverse views of the city will be created, exhibited, judged and awarded, before being made available for sale and enjoyment at our **Gala Private View** and following **Exhibition** during the course of the **Hostry Festival**.

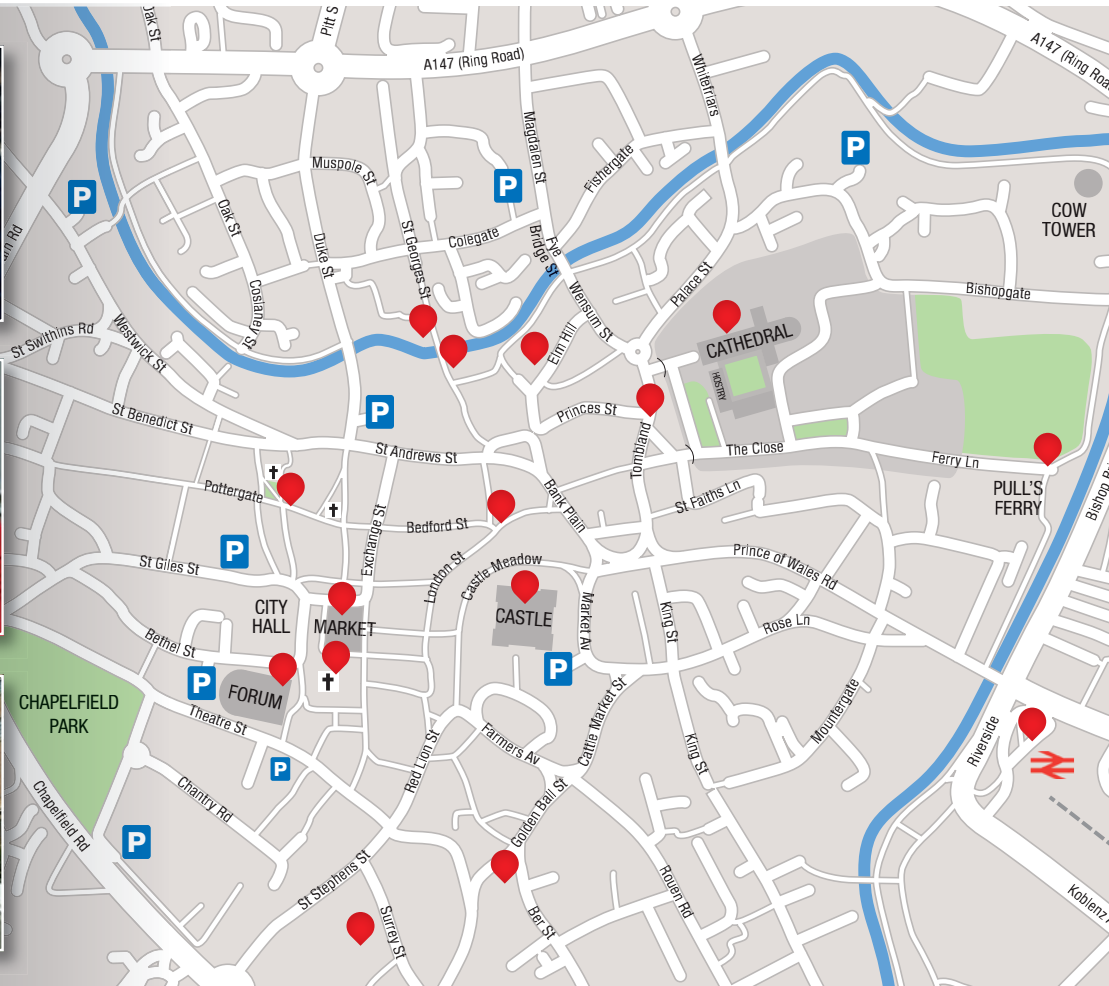
