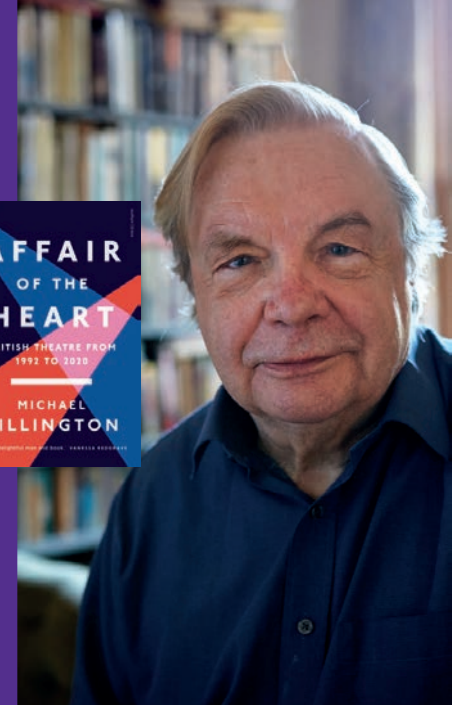

Naji's new book is all about good rapport between practitioners and veterans suffering from PTSD.

Veterans are proud people with a lot of dignity. They have been trained to fight to win but not to lose. When they get traumatised by an accident and they break down it is new to them. It is not in the army manual to guide them though the darkness that overwhelms them. So being asked to talk about this darkness to professionals goes against the grain. Most prefer not to engage.

Naji Malak has 35 years experience treating veterans with acupuncture and through his charity Stand Easy he believes the less talking the more effective treatments can be.

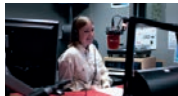

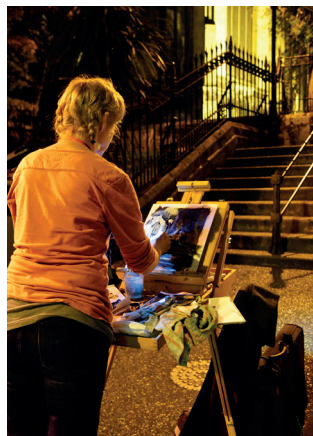

# Paint Out Norwich 2022

This autumn, we are revisiting Norwich and its contrasting medieval streets and modern shops with a specific emphasis on a Nocturne painting festival running Thursday evening through to a Saturday Private View and Sunday exhibition in Cathedral Close, Tombland.

Nocturnes were originally associated with musical compositions evocating the night but the word mutated to the visual arts under Rembrandt's influence in 17<sup>th</sup>-century Holland. It has since become common parlance in the Fine Arts, albeit with Whistlerian connotations.

Paint Out has showcased Nocturne painting since we began in 2014. This year's October event will be primarily focused on the plein air skill of painting as the sun disappears and evening lights appear, perhaps reflecting on damp cobbles, the neon glows of shops and yellowed street lamps.

We are proud to have hosted hundreds of artists, over the last nine years, who have taken up the challenge of painting by night, even at the end of a long day's art creation. This time, our days will begin at sundown and the evenings will mark the beginning of painting as late night shoppers, drinkers and diners continue to fill the city.

Artists may use LED lights clamped above their boards or seek out the sulphurous glow of the Georgian and Victorian street lamps in the medieval quarter of the city or the night-lit storefronts and hospitality venues around the city's centre and illuminated lanes.

For the collector and gallery visitor this is a chance to view a selling exhibition of freshly painted works, hot off the easel that bask in the beauty of the city at night from dozens of familiar and unseen vantage points.

Come scrutinize the choice of composition and often innovative use of reduced palette colour or perhaps witness how some artists elicit an almost Hogarthian realism in rendering the nightlife of Norwich's early twilight hours.

Paint Out will host the Nocturne Paint Out in a marquee on the green outside the Cathedral Hostry.

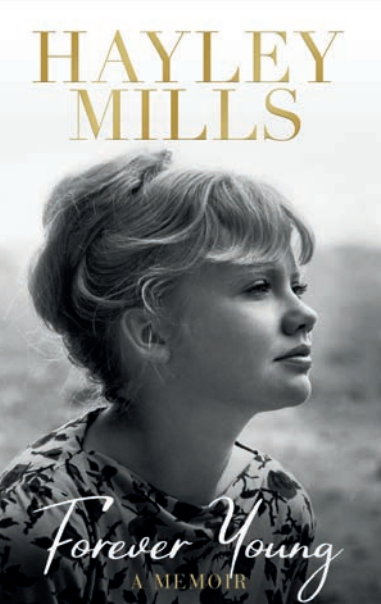

Lady Glenconner is the author of the acclaimed best-selling memoir *Lady in Waiting*, as well as two murder mystery novels, *Murder on Mustique* and *A Haunting at Holkham*.

She was born Lady Anne Coke in 1932, the eldest daughter of the 5th Earl of Leicester, growing up in their ancestral estate at Holkham Hall in Norfolk. A Maid of Honour at the Queen’s Coronation, she married Lord Glenconner in 1956. In 1958 she and her husband began to transform the island of Mustique into a paradise for the rich and famous. They granted a plot of land to Princess Margaret who built her favourite home there. She was appointed Lady in Waiting to Princess Margaret in 1971 and kept this role – accompanying her on many state occasions and foreign tours – until her death in 2002. Turning 90 this Platinum Jubilee year, Anne Glenconner – now an international best-selling author – shares what she has learned from her extraordinary and unexpected life.

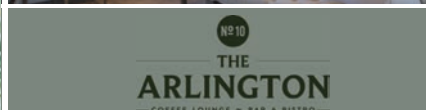
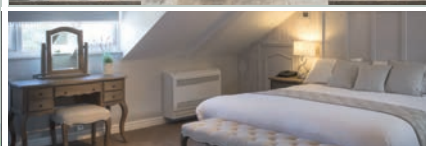
