Director's Note

Sir Peter Ustinov's fascinating comedy drama has been "in the wings" for us to produce pretty much since Peter Barrow and I founded the festival over a decade ago now.

In 1995 I had the joy of playing 'Beethoven' in a production I produced Off West End in London. The play was directed by Paul Eddington's daughter Gemma, and playing opposite me was his son Toby Eddington, with the Hostry Festival's Rebecca Chapman as 'Countess Giulietta Guicciardi'. For a number of years now we have felt the title alone would be the perfect fit for our 10th anniversary, let alone the fact that this very rarely staged play provides so much material in which to base a whole festival's programming around.

Throughout our 10th anniversary season you will see creative connectivity with the Beethoven theme, starting so perfectly with the introduction 10 minute film each night by Rebecca Chapman's Total Ensemble Theatre Company, inspired by Beethoven's Egmont Overture. Our festival commission to Norfolk sculptor Rachael Long has proved to be such an inspiring exchange, resulting in her creation being depicted on this program cover, a full week's exhibition at the Hostry during the festival, and the sculpture itself being the 10th member of our cast on stage! We have commissioned new music for the opening of the play itself, plus a 45 minute premiere of William Fergusson's piano concert, entitled TENTH.
Festival Artist in Residence Christopher Ellis will also be delivering a Piano Improvisation Concert based on Beethoven's music style; and international pianist Gloria Campaner joins us with a concert that includes Beethoven's music. Such is the magnitude of this master of music, there remains an endless field of possibilities to be inspired by.


And so, to Beethoven himself, delivered straight into the 21st century, courtesy of our production here at the Hostry Festival.

Chris Whitley is new to the festival and is someone I have wanted to work with for a number of years, together these two truly talented actors lead our cast of Norfolk talent into Ustinov's world of accessible intellect, humour, passion, love and loss, and most importantly of all, life long-learning.

I really am, as always, beyond super proud of the dedication of the whole team, both on and off stage, with particular gratitude to Eleanor Hicks & Suzanna Redford. I feel sure you will appreciate and enjoy this evening for so many reasons, many of which will unfold in conversations about it all post the performance. I adore this play, the family within it, and the actors portraying it so wonderfully, and all those unexpected guests who appear within the story and help change lives for the better.
