'Doughnut' is sweet move for Dauntless

Carving what is known as a 'maritime doughnut', HMS Dauntless demonstrates her impressive manoeuvrability as she prepares to join the largest war games held in north-west Europe this year.

The destroyer, which is twinned with Great Yarmouth, struck out in the North Sea to join nearly three dozen warships, two dozen different types of aircraft, and upwards of 13,000 military personnel converging on Scotland's east and west coasts for Exercise Joint Warrior.

The two-week-long war game, which involves a dozen Royal Navy vessels, with input from nine other nations and navies, will see Dauntless put to the test in her primary role: shielding a task group from air attack courtesy of her Sea Viper missiles.

To prepare for the test, the Portsmouth-based

warship was thrown around in the North Sea at speed. The 'doughnut' was created by testing both engines at full speed – over 30kts – and turning left or right.

Throughout Joint Warrior, the destroyer has a Merlin helicopter from 829 Naval Air Squadron in Culdrose as aerial support; it was from its cargo door that her aircrewman PO 'Taff' Morris took these photographs.

The search is on to find some talented young musicians, poets and writers to star in a new showcase event at this year's Hostry Festival.

they believe show real promise and star quality.

Melanie Kidd, a youth projects coordinator from Writers' Centre Norwich who will manage the project and co-host the event, said: "I am interested in originality and authenticity, where inspiration comes from life experience. There is a combined understanding of the necessity for creative writing provision, in all forms.

"We will be looking for young people who write, compose and create their own writing and lyrics and provide support in their artistic development."

Future Radio presenter Richard Penguin, who will also co-host Debut, said: "Norwich has a history of producing a wealth of creative and talented artists, musicians, poets and writers.

"What they all have in common is that they need encouragement to make that first public appearance, and a platform in which to do so.

"I believe Debut will offer many young people their first opportunity to do so as part of a prestigious festival taking their work to another level."

Hostry Festival director Stash Kirkbride said that Debut was a project he had wanted to introduce into the festival for some time.

He added: "Our aim is to create an atmosphere where

new talent can be seen in a supportive and non-judgmental way. This project is all about 'the taking part'; a unique opportunity for young people to be seen, heard and understood."

The 12 young people selected to be part of Debut will also benefit from having professional mentors to support their talent and development.


