ARTISTS OPEN STUDIO DOORS

It's a great time for art lovers in the county as Norfolk & Norwich Open Studios gets underway. For just over two weeks hundreds of artists will be throwing open the doors to their workplaces and inviting people in to see their work, talk about it and (hopefully) buy it.

Last year 450 artists in 255 venues, including 16 Norfolk schools, were involved and the event has established itself as one of the largest and most successful open studio schemes in the country.

Additionally there are art trails, taster exhibitions and events and demonstrations tied in to the programme. Studios are free to visit and visitors don't need to book in advance, unless they are a large group.

IT IS ROCKET SCIENCE

'It isn't rocket science,' goes the old saying, but for pupils from Hunstanton's Glebe House School that is exactly what it was when they competed at the regional finals of the Race for the Line Model Rocket Car Challenge at RAF Honington. Competing among 32 teams and supported by Glebe's head of computing, Bill Robinson, two of the school's teams finished second and third in the secondary schools category, just a few hundredths of a second off the winners.

The event was part of the national Science, Technology, Engineering & Mathematics (STEM) Initiative involving 850 primary and secondary schools across the UK.
